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
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# Dictionary of the Most Important Contradictions in the Bible



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## Introduction

As a matter of fact, in the Holy Scriptures, consistency, cohesion and coherence among texts can serve as evidence for the oneness of source and sound ascription. On the contrary, the inconsistency and incoherence of texts can serve as evidence for the multiplicity of sources and false ascription.

Therefore, some of the many proofs of the oneness of the source of the Qur'an and its sound ascription to God are the consistency, cohesion and coherence among its texts. About that, in the Qur'an, God says:

**Then do they not reflect upon the Qur'an if it had been from [any] other than Allah they would have found within it much contradiction (An-Nisa 4:82)**

On the contrary, when it comes to the Bible, some of the ample proofs of the multiplicity of its sources and the invalid ascription of a good deal of its contents to God are the remarkable contradictions, inconsistencies and discrepancies among its verses, chapters and books both in the Old Testament and the New Testament.

Indeed, the Bible contradictions, inconsistencies and discrepancies are uncountable. Therefore, we content ourselves with the most important biblical contradictions, inconsistencies and discrepancies which do not require check, scrutiny or verification. You will find manifest contradictions which catch the eye at first blush. So, they do not need argumentation, evidence or even study.

At last, God was right when He said that his truly pure words are free from contradictions and inconsistencies. As for God's words mixed with men's words, they abound in many contradictions and inconsistencies.







<b>How Long did Noah’s Flood Continue?</b>	
<p>(Genesis 7:17)</p>	<p><sup>17</sup>The flood continued for forty days on the earth; the water increased and lifted up the ark so that it rose above the earth.</p>
<p>(Genesis 7:23-24)</p>	<p><sup>23</sup>He wiped out every living thing that was on the face of the earth, from mankind to livestock, to creatures that crawl, to the birds of the sky, and they were wiped off the earth. Only Noah was left, and those that were with him in the ark. <sup>24</sup>And the water surged on the earth 150 days.</p>

it. <sup>28</sup>And the work of the bases was on this manner: they had panels; <sup>[a]</sup>and there were panels between the ledges; <sup>29</sup>and on the panels that were between the ledges were lions, oxen, and cherubim; and upon the ledges <sup>[b]</sup>there was a pedestal above; and beneath the lions and oxen were wreaths of hanging work. <sup>30</sup>And every base had four brazen wheels, and axles of brass; and the four feet thereof had <sup>[c]</sup>undersetters: beneath the laver were the undersetters molten, with wreaths at the side of each. <sup>31</sup>And the mouth of it within the capital and above was a cubit: and the mouth thereof was round after the work of a pedestal, a cubit and a half; and also upon the mouth of it were gravings, and their panels were foursquare, not round. <sup>32</sup>And the four wheels were underneath the panels; and the axletrees of the wheels were in the base: and the height of a wheel was a cubit and half a cubit. <sup>33</sup>And the work of the wheels was like the work of a chariot wheel: their axletrees, and their felloes, and their spokes, and their naves, were all molten. <sup>34</sup>And there were four undersetters at the four corners of each base: the undersetters thereof

(Matthew 4:23-25)	<sup>23</sup> And <sup>[a]</sup> Jesus went about in all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the <sup>[b]</sup> gospel of the kingdom, and healing all manner of disease and all manner of sickness among the people. <sup>24</sup> And the report of him went forth into all Syria: and they brought unto him all that were sick, holden with divers diseases and torments, <sup>[c]</sup> possessed with demons, and epileptic, and palsied; and he healed them. <sup>25</sup> And there followed him great multitudes from Galilee and Decapolis and Jerusalem and Judaea and <i>from</i> beyond the Jordan.

## Most Important Contradictions in 1 Peter & 2

### Peter

#### Should a Christian Answer a non-Christian?

(1 Peter 3:15)	<p><sup>15</sup>but sanctify in your hearts Christ as Lord: <i>being</i> ready always to give answer to every man that asketh you a reason concerning the hope that is in you, yet with meekness and fear</p>
(Colossians 4:5-6)	<p><sup>5</sup>Walk in wisdom toward them that are without, <sup>[a]</sup>redeeming the time. <sup>6</sup>Let your speech be always with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer each one.</p>
(2 John 1:7-11)	<p><sup>7</sup>For many deceivers are gone forth into the world, <i>even</i> they that confess not that Jesus Christ cometh in the flesh. This is the deceiver and the antichrist. <sup>8</sup>Look to yourselves, that ye <sup>[a]</sup>lose not the things which <sup>[b]</sup>we have wrought, but that ye receive a full reward. <sup>9</sup>Whosoever <sup>[c]</sup>goeth onward and abideth not in the teaching of Christ, hath not God: he that abideth in the teaching, the same hath both the Father and the Son. <sup>10</sup>If any one cometh unto you, and bringeth not this teaching, receive him not into <i>your</i> house, and give him no greeting: <sup>11</sup>for he that giveth him greeting partaketh in his evil works.</p>

<b>Was Lot Really Righteous?</b>	
(2 Peter 2:7-8)	<p><sup>7</sup>and delivered righteous Lot, sore distressed by the lascivious life of the wicked <sup>8</sup>(for that righteous man dwelling among them, in seeing and hearing, <sup>9</sup>vexed <i>his</i> righteous soul from day to day with <i>their</i> lawless deeds)</p>
(Genesis 19:30-38)	<p><sup>30</sup>And Lot went up out of Zoar, and dwelt in the mountain, and his two daughters with him; for he feared to dwell in Zoar: and he dwelt in a cave, he and his two daughters. <sup>31</sup>And the first-born said unto the younger, Our father is old, and there is not a man in the earth to come in unto us after the manner of all the earth: <sup>32</sup>come, let us make our father drink wine, and we will lie with him, that we may preserve seed of our father. <sup>33</sup>And they made their father drink wine that night: and the first-born went in, and lay with her father; and he knew not when she lay down, nor when she arose. <sup>34</sup>And it came to pass on the morrow, that the first-born said unto the younger, Behold, I lay yesternight with my father: let us make him drink wine this night also; and go thou in, and lie with him, that we may preserve seed of our father. <sup>35</sup>And they made their father drink wine that night also: and the younger arose, and lay with him; and he knew not when she lay down, nor when she arose. <sup>36</sup>Thus were both the daughters of Lot with child by their father. <sup>37</sup>And the first-born bare a son, and called his name Moab: the same is the father of the Moabites unto this day. <sup>38</sup>And the younger, she also bare a son, and called his name Ben-ammi: the same is the father of the children of Ammon unto this day.</p>

### John

#### Is Everyone Believing in Incarnation One of God?

(1 John 4:2)	<sup>2</sup> Hereby know ye the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesseth that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is of God:
(1 John 4:15)	<sup>15</sup> Whosoever shall confess that Jesus is the Son of God, God abideth in him, and he in God.
(1 John 5:1)	<b>5</b> Whosoever believeth that Jesus is the Christ is begotten of God: and whosoever loveth him that begat loveth him also that is begotten of him.
(Mark 1:23-24)	<sup>23</sup> And straightway there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit; and he cried out, <sup>24</sup> saying, What have we to do with thee, Jesus thou Nazarene? art thou come to destroy us? I know thee who thou art, the Holy One of God.
(Mark 3:11)	<sup>11</sup> And the unclean spirits, whensoever they beheld him, fell down before him, and cried, saying, Thou art the Son of God.

## Most Important Contradictions in Revelation

### Was All Grass Burnt up?

<sup>7</sup>And the first sounded, and there followed hail and fire, mingled with blood, and they were cast <sup>[a]</sup>upon the earth: and the third part of the earth was burnt up, and the third part of the trees was burnt up, and all green grass was burnt up. (Revelation 8:7)

<sup>4</sup>And it was said unto them that they should not hurt the grass of the earth, neither any green thing, neither any tree, but only such men as have not the seal of God on their foreheads. (Revelation 9:4)
